Assessment

- <u>September</u>: Baseline testing by all class teachers (P1 GL Assessment Baseline test). P4 and P6 CAT (computerised Cognitive Ability Test) – individuals PTE / PTM tests are then compared to this score
- <u>January:</u> Teachers own class tests eg high frequency words, spellings, comprehension, grammar punctuation and sentence structure and numeracy. (Writing levelled all year)
- <u>May:</u> P3 P7 computerised PTE (Progress Test in English) and PTM (Progress Test in Maths)
- PASS (Pupil Attitude to School and Self)
- CCEA tasks used continuously from P1 to P7 to level the children in preparation for end of KS1 and end of KS2 leveling (Levels 1 through to 5)
- Computerised reading tests, spelling tests Dyslexia and dyscalculia screening are used diagnostically with individuals if the PTE / PTM tests highlight concerns and following professional judgement by the class teacher
