



Restart Education 2020



- ***Does my child have to attend school in September?***

Yes, an induction programme is in place for nurturing and restarting education.

How will you keep my child safe?

We will be putting measures with some details below to keep our community as safe as possible. We cannot guarantee that your child will not be ill S/he could become unwell at any time.

- ***What will my child wear?***

It is preferable that a clean uniform is worn each day. Children should bring a coat for outdoor play.

- ***Can I call into the school office to drop something off or meet my child's teacher?***

No, school building is closed to everyone except staff and pupils. Please call or email us.

You will need:

Ready to learn resources:
Stationery pack detailed
in the letter sent in July (a
copy available on the
school website).

A labelled bottle of
sanitiser if sending your
own child in with some.

All children will need
plenty of water in a
labelled bottle.

Children should walk into
school grounds on their
own and walk directly to
their designated entrance
door.

Other information:

Tissues, soap, sanitiser
and antibacterial wipes to
help keep your child safe
in their classroom.

Adults must remain
outside school building,
maintain a 2m distance
from others.

**No child should arrive at
school before 8:45am.
Perimeter gate will be
closed until this time.**

Each class will form its
own bubble.
As far as possible,
these bubbles will not
mix.

School response if a child displays symptoms during school time.

Concern raised by the child themselves or by an adult supervising.

Person isolated immediately in the accessible toilet. Child's contact list will be rang.

Child **must** be collected **immediately** from school.

Mandatory period of Self Isolation

Negative Test Result:

It is important to still apply caution. If everyone with symptoms who was tested in the household receive a negative result, person can return to school providing they are well enough and have not had a fever for 48 hours.

Negative test

Parents **MUST** inform school of test outcome **immediately**.

Test **MUST** be arranged and **must** take place.

The family must engage with the Test and Trace process.

Positive test

Positive Test Result: YOU MUST INFORM SCHOOL OF ANY TEST RESULT

All staff and pupils in this bubble must self isolate and take a test

What if someone in my house displays symptoms?

Isolate your child where possible.

Do not allow your child to attend school or other public places.

Mandatory self-isolation period according to current PHA guidelines.

Inform school if your child is displaying symptoms.

Negative Test Result:

If everyone with symptoms who was tested in their household receive a negative result, child can return to school providing they are well enough and have not had a fever for 48 hours.

Negative test

Parents **MUST** inform school of test outcome **immediately**.

Test **MUST** be arranged and **must** take place.

The Family must engage with the Test and Trace process.

Positive test

Positive Test Result: The child must complete the compulsory self-isolation from the date of the test.
Parent must inform school immediately.

What if I am contacted by NHS Test and Trace?

Other FAQs

Will my child need to bring a change of clothes?

No, items other than a school coat must not be brought between home and school. PE kit will be worn on PE days.

Will my child need a school bag?

No, items must not be brought between home and school other than snack and lunch.

My child has medication. How do I arrange for this to be taken in school time?

Please contact the school office if any medications are required during the school day.

Will my child be allowed to bring in a toy or comforter?

No toys are permitted to be brought from home.

Will children social distance in school?

Children within the same bubble will be in their class groups. Guidance states that children within the bubble may not be able to distance socially. Adults will distance 2m from children as much as possible.
