They took part in an environmental tour, an Eco art workshop and an interactive recycling workshop with our local council. Driven by the guidelines set out in the NI Curriculum for the arts, the children had great fun at this highly stimulating and engaging programme that encouraged their development of creative skills. We hope to raise awareness in our school about the impact on the oceans and marine life and also the effect of waste on our planet and how we are able to make changes to our everyday life.

Children have been learning about Fair Trade through their involvement in the Fair Aware Award.
