Homework

Homework is sent home each afternoon in the homework folder and should be returned to school the following morning – completed by the child and signed by an adult. Reading, Spellings and Mental Maths will be set each night and in addition:

- Monday: Sentence writing activity using spellings;
- Tuesday: High Frequency Word Cards;
- Wednesday: Literacy or Numeracy written activity (related to class work):
- Thursday: Revision (for Friday spelling test).

<u>ICT</u>

Your child will have access to iPads, cameras, computers and interactive whiteboards to support their learning throughout the year.

Topic work

Pupils in P2 will develop their scientific, geographical and historical knowledge in the World Around Us (WAU) topics areas of The World, Technology and People. Structured play areas are based on the topic.

Please read and discuss aspects of these topic areas at every opportunity.

Pupils will also work on their <u>Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities (TSPC)</u> throughout their topic work including: Working with Others, Being Creative, Managing Information, Problem Solving/Decision making and Self-Management. Again please encourage opportunities for your child to develop these skills at home as well. Ask your teacher for ideas if needed.

PE kit

Pupils are required to participate in PE as a mandatory curricular area. Administration—Dinner Money:

MONDAY ONLY (or first day back after a holiday)

Dinner money (as with all other monies) must be sent to school in an envelope with your child's name clearly written and the preferred days for dinner clearly noted. Exact money must be sent. Dinner costs £2.60 per day. Healthy break provided by Mrs Kelly (Monday—Thursday) is to be paid for on the previous Friday (£1.20 per week), or you may bring your own healthy snack. We operate a Healthy Eating school policy, although Friday is treat day. Please send in healthy items for packed lunch. The school canteen will serve healthy dinners with chips served once a week. *All money must come to school in a labelled envelope, with money separated accordingly e.g. separate envelopes for dinner money / healthy break money / breakfast club money.

Before & After school clubs and activities

We continue to offer Breakfast Club from 8.15am daily at a cost of £1 per day, payable on the Friday of the previous week. We offer a very wide range of after school activities including football, hockey, ICT, netball, cross country, hip-hop, gymnastics, cycling proficiency and athletics. Many of these only operate for P4 upwards. P2 have the opportunity to stay late for gymnastics / hip-hop, football and hockey (subject to change). These activities are delivered by professional coaches and will incur a charge—more info on dates and payment will follow. Answer short comprehension questions based on a short piece of text - literal and inferential

Writina:

Structure a short piece of writing (fictional and non-fictional), including a simple beginning, middle and ending. Each sentence should include the appropriate use of capital letters, a full stop and finger spacing between words. High Frequency words should be spelt correctly and attention paid to the difference between words which can be sounded out and those which cannot

Linguistic Phonics Scheme: 4 words which can be sounded out and 2 words which cannot be sounded out (High Frequency words) sent home daily and tested on a Friday along with a dictated sentence.
